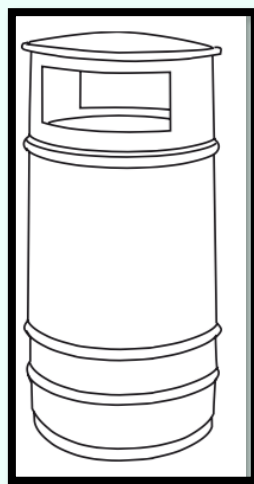
Now it's time to be creative! Use your hands, your ideas and your voice to create a new innovative artwork.

The winning artwork will be turned in to a graphic design and displayed on the bins around your school.



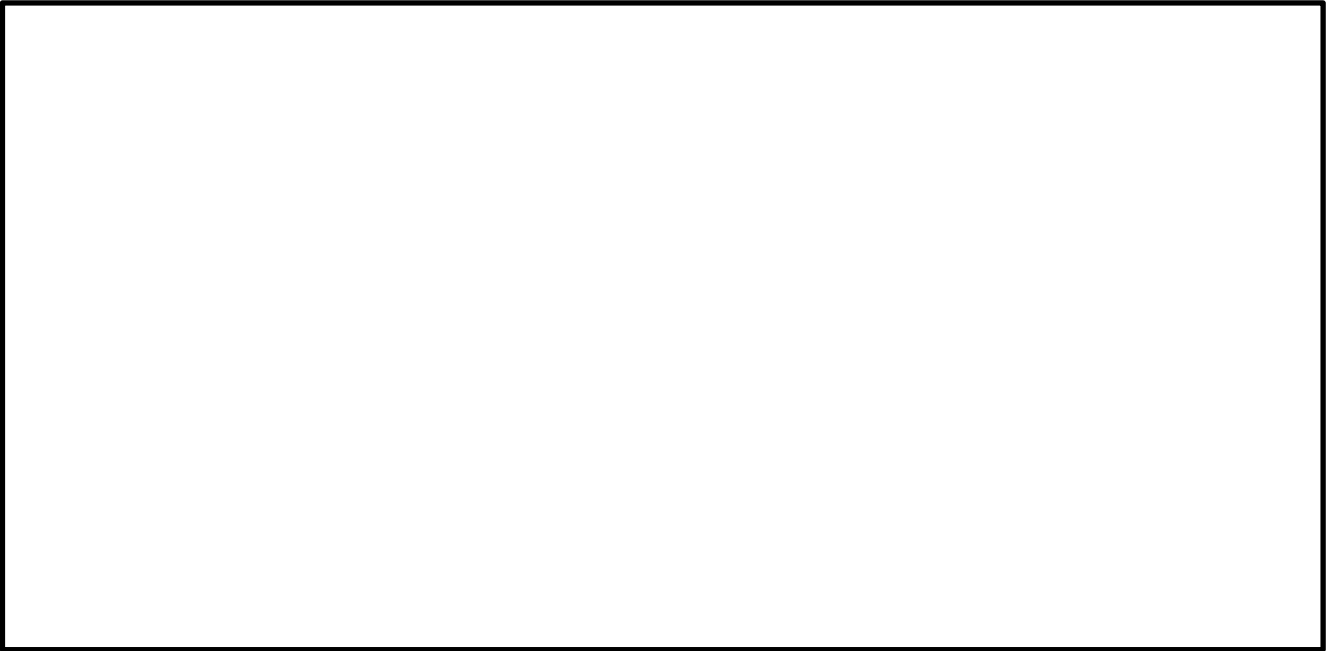

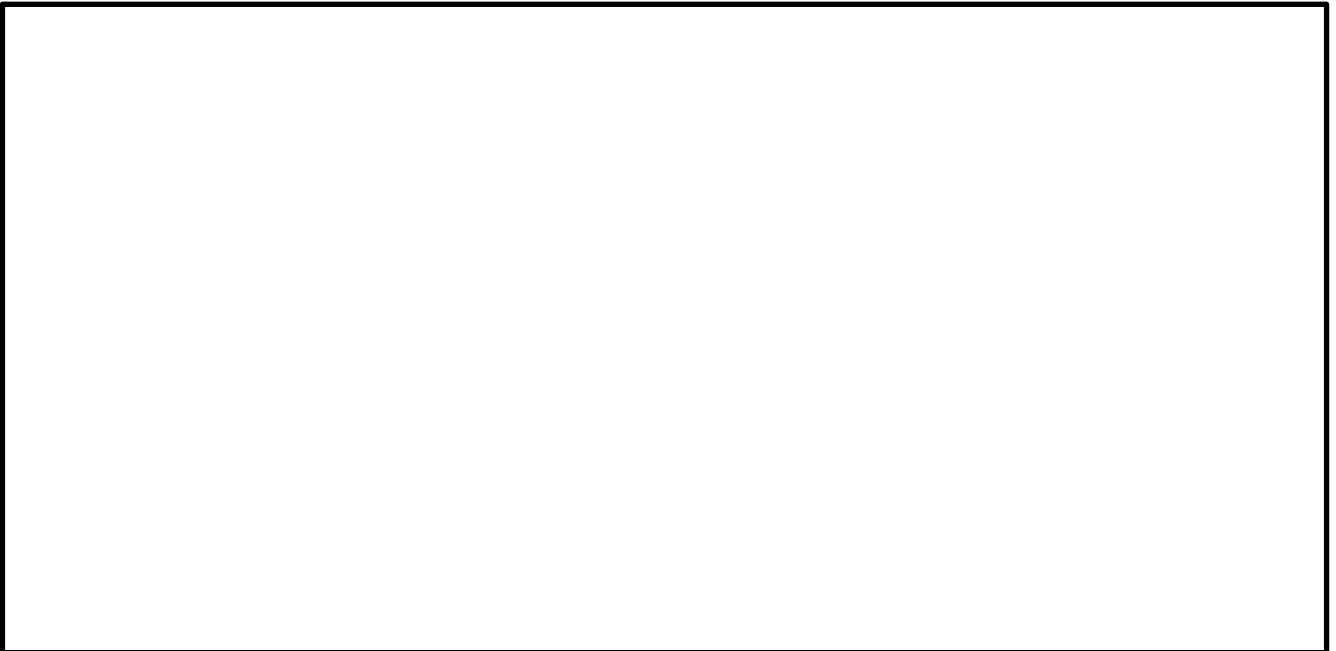
